Women's Open champion-


ships were all held here. In '54 the legendary "Babe" Didrikson Zaharias stunned the gallery with her comeback victory just months after surgery for colon cancer. It is in her spirit that the 1-in-8 Challenge is being held today to help women fight breast cancer and thrive.

#### THE LPGA TAKES AIM AGAINST BREAST CANCER

The LPGA has dedicated itself to finding a cure for breast cancer. Its charitable tournaments have raised nearly \$85.5 million since 1981 toward that cause. Affected first-hand by breast cancer, LPGA members have come to know only too well the devastating effects of the disease on women, family, and friends. In 1993, the LPGA lost 28-year-

old Heather Farr to breast cancer. In 1996, Kathy
Ahern succumbed to the disease at the age of 47.
In 1992, the LPGA designated the Susan G.
Komen Breast Cancer Foundation as its Official
National Charity. Today, LPGA players have brought
their campaign to the local level by joining forces
with The Malden Breast Health Initiative.

#### THE 1-IN-8 CHALLENGE

The American Cancer Society estimates that ONE IN EIGHT women will experience breast cancer in her lifetime. One in eight. This despite advances in medical research and technology. In Malden, the number of women who died from breast cancer in 1995 was 39% higher than the state average. The mortality rate in Massachusetts is significantly higher than the national norm. Clearly, breast cancer is occurring in "epidemic" proportions. Research is important, but early detection is currently a woman's best hope for a cure.

The Malden Breast Health Initiative is bringing that hope to women at risk for breast cancer today.

Through education, free screenings, treatment and follow-up care, the Initiative is dramatically increasing the chances of early detection and survival. The Initiative serves all women, but especially those who are under- or uninsured. Obtaining quality health care is difficult enough for women with means and access. For those challenged by lack of education or limited circumstance, the obstacles can be unbearable.



OF FAME 1991 — Westford native
and local favorite Pat Bradley has won
six major championship titles and is the
only woman to ever win all four of the
modern majors. She was the fourth
player in LPGA history to reach the \$1-

million mark and became the first player in LPGA history to surpass the \$2-, \$3-, and \$4-million milestones in career earnings.

SANDRA HAYNIE, LPGA HALL OF FAME 1977 — Sandra is the winner of 14



In 1974, she became only the second woman to win the LPGA Championship and the U.S. Women's Open in the same season. Battling

arthritis from the age of 33, Sandra heads the annual celebrity pro-am, "Swing Against Arthritis," benefiting the Texas chapter of the National Arthritis Foundation.

KATHY WHITWORTH, LPGA
HALL OF FAME 1975 — A Tour
player since 1958, Kathy has an unprecedented 88 career wins, an all-time record
for both men's and women's U.S. Tours.
A winner of six major championships,
Kathy has been awarded Player of the Year
seven times. She was the first woman in the
history of the LPGA to surpass the \$1-million
earnings mark.

#### REGISTRATION & FORMAT

Registration will be limited to 100 players and will be accepted on a first-come, first-serve basis. The deadline for registration is September 5, but earlier sign-ups are encouraged. Registration cannot be guaranteed, and golf slots will not be reserved, until payment is received.

The entry fee is \$5,000 per foursome, or \$1,250 per player. Fees include continental breakfast, morning clinics, greens fee, golf cart, gift, lunch, reception, dinner, and prizes. Corporate foursomes include Tee sponsorships valued at \$2,500 each. No refunds will be made after September 5 unless reservations are sold to other players.

The tournament will be played in a scramble format. Each foursome will be joined by an LPGA pro.
